

For over eleven years, C&WJ Co-operative Credit Union has supported education by awarding bursaries and scholarships to the children of its members and staff through the High School Assistance Programme (HSAP).

To date, over 1100 students have benefited with an average of 100 students benefiting each year. The awardees are selected based on their performance in the Primary Exit Profile (PEP) or their high school end of year examinations. This year was no different and a total of 130 children received bursaries and scholarships of \$25,000 each across 21 branches.
